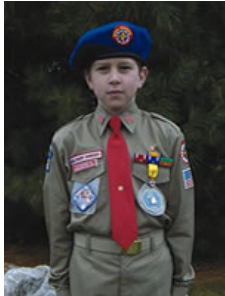




DISCOVERY RANGERS UNIFORM GUIDE



The purpose of the Discovery Rangers uniform is to identify a boy as a Discovery Ranger and to give him a place to proudly wear the advancement and merit awards that he has earned.



The official Class A uniform is a Discovery Rangers long-sleeved khaki shirt with a Royal Rangers Emblem and US Flag worn on the left sleeve near the shoulder. The District Strip and Outpost Numerals are worn on the right sleeve near the shoulder. Accompanying the shirt is a Discovery Rangers red necktie with Royal Rangers tie tack, a khaki web belt with brass buckle (available at the Ranger Supply Store), khaki trousers, navy blue or black dress socks, and polished black or brown leather dress shoes. As an option, a boy may choose to wear the blue Royal Ranger beret with his Class A uniform and really stand out in a crowd.



The official Class B uniform is a Discovery Rangers long-sleeved or short-sleeved khaki shirt with a Royal Rangers Emblem and US Flag worn on the left sleeve near the shoulder. The District Strip and Outpost Numerals are worn on the right sleeve near the shoulder. Accompanying the shirt is a Discovery Rangers red bolo tie, a khaki web belt with brass buckle, khaki trousers (or khaki shorts with the short-sleeved shirt), navy blue or black dress socks (white socks when wearing shorts), and black or brown shoes. As an option, a boy may choose to wear the blue Royal Ranger beret, a Royal Ranger baseball cap, or a Discovery Rangers baseball cap with his Class B uniform. This is the uniform that the boys will be expected to wear to outpost meetings during the school year (September through May) and most outings or Outpost events.



The official Class C uniform is comprised of a tan denim award vest that should be worn over a Royal Rangers or Discovery Rangers T-shirt and either blue jeans or khaki shorts. Socks and shoes for this uniform are at the boy's discretion (although they should be clean and in good condition). As an option, a boy may choose to wear a Royal Rangers baseball cap or a Discovery Rangers baseball cap with his Class C uniform. The tan denim vest is where a Discovery Ranger will display his merit awards, leadership training awards, event patches, and previously earned advancement badges. The Class C uniform is acceptable for the boys to wear to Outpost meetings during the summer months (June through August), numerous outings and field trips, and to most Outpost events. Boys wishing to wear khaki shorts with their Class C uniform must purchase this item from the Ranger Store.
